Purpose of IEA awards

- To encourage, promote, and recognize outstanding scholarly work based on IEA data conducted by graduates, postgraduates, and established researchers
- To encourage secondary IEA research on a variety of topics and methodological issues associated with large-scale assessments, including within-country and comparative studies of factors related to student achievement and attitudes



Annual awards

- IEA Bruce H. Choppin & Richard M. Wolf Memorial Awards
- Entries are judged by the IEA Awards Committee, chaired by Dr Seamus Hegarty (IEA PEC Chair)
- Prize: €500 and a certificate from IEA

Applying for an IEA award

Research questions may include, but are not restricted to, the following:

- within-country studies of the background factors behind educational attitudes or achievement;
- comparative studies of factors related to achievement across multiple countries;
- methodological issues associated with conducting large-scale educational research investigations of within-country achievement results via examination of data from comparison countries; and
- implications/application of secondary analysis findings for evaluating and improving educational policy and practice



Applying for an IEA award (Cont.)

Criteria for judging both awards:

- importance of the problem;
- conceptualization and design of the study;
- methods of analysis employed;
- adequacy of the reporting and discussion; and
- reasonableness of the conclusions

Deadline: 31 March of each year

Both awards take the form of a certificate and a prize of € 500

 Authors of exceptionally innovative papers/theses may be invited to present their results at the IEA General Assembly meeting
